

Follow-Up Care for Children Prescribed ADHD Medication (ADD)



Why the ADD HEDIS® measure is important:

- Attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder is one of the most commonly diagnosed disorders in children
- Children prescribed ADD medication need to be closely monitored and supported to maintain treatment compliance, effectiveness, and medication management

What you need to do:

1. When ADHD is first diagnosed, initiate a 30-day supply of medication, as necessary.
2. At prescription appointment schedule 29-day follow-up visit prior to patient leaving the office
**See stand alone initiation phase CPT visit codes, on right*
3. At follow-up visit, schedule 3rd and 4th visit prior to patient leaving the office.
**See chart below*
4. Maintenance prescribing lasts for at least 7 months.
5. Follow-up visits needed to meet measure = 3
